Course Description per the Course Catalog

Skills-based course introducing computer crime through an overview of the criminal acts that can be committed using a computer or the Internet, and how those acts can be successfully investigated. Also includes the legal aspects of search and seizure, proper procedures for handling digital evidence in relation to the rules of evidence, and the use of basic imaging equipment. Requires 6 hours in the lab each week.

Reading for this class is NOT optional. You should have the chapter assigned to the corresponding week read before coming to class. There will be a ten point multiple choice quiz given on Tuesdays, as outlined in the attached schedule, at the beginning of class and will cover the chapter assigned for that week.

Class Policies

Be on time to class. If you arrive late, please be courteous to others by entering as quietly as possible. If for some reason you do need to leave early, please let me know at the beginning of class and then sit close to the door so you can leave as quietly as possible.

Attendance and class participation are required in order to pass this class. Grades and assignments

- I. Tuesday Quizzes – There will be a total of 09 quizzes consisting of 10 multiple choice questions. Each quiz will be worth 10 points for a total of 90 points. The tested material will cover the chapters from the assigned reading as designated on the attached schedule. Each quiz will cover the chapter(s) assigned for that week and will not be comprehensive. These quizzes are designed to test your knowledge of key concepts covered in the reading material.
- II. Midterm and Final – The midterm and final are not comprehensive and are worth 40 points each. Both the midterm and the final will have a written and a practical exercise that will be graded. The tests will cover concepts introduced in the reading and in the classroom lectures.
- III. Class Presentation – Each student will be expected to prepare a 10 minute presentation on an assigned Cyber Law statute. These will be given on Thursdays as indicated on the attached class schedule and will be worth a total of 20 points.
- IV. Participation – Ten points will be awarded for participation. Students are encouraged to engage in discussions, participate in class projects and contribute to the learning environment of the classroom.

There is no extra credit or make-up work for unexcused absences. Do not expect preferential treatment if you decide part way through the semester that you need to exert more effort. Start working hard from the beginning of the semester and you should have no problem staying on schedule.
