**COURSE DESCRIPTION**

For students in all disciplines who are interested in the fundamental scientific principles of behavior. The student will study learning, motivation, emotion, personality, mental disorders, treatment alternatives and other related subjects as part of the course. Critical thinking will be explored in examining these aspects of behavior. Students will have frequent examinations and quizzes as part of the course requirements. This course satisfies general education requirements in the social sciences area. 3 lecture hours per week.

## EARNING POINTS IN THIS COURSE

### 1. Discussion Threads

As with many online courses, it can be difficult to make up for the thought provoking and many times lively discussions that occur in the typical lecture based course. The goal of discussion threads for this course is to instigate critical thinking about the many topics in this particular subject. We can all gain a lot more insight about entertaining the many different perspectives we all have on these topics!

Each week I will post a question related to the chapter we are on. You will be required to post a reply/answer to my question (using the textbook to answer). **Your reply to my question will need to be submitted by Wednesday midnight.** In addition, you will also be required to reply to at least 2 other discussion threads that have been posted by your classmates. **You must make sure that your two classmate submission replies are submitted by Friday midnight.** The reason why I am requiring that your thread submission to my question be submitted by Wednesday as opposed to Friday (as your classmate submissions are) is so that we all have enough submissions to reply to. I have found in previous semesters that with our busy schedules it can be easy to wait till Friday (deadline day) to post all 3 submissions. This defeats the purpose as the submissions and replies are rushed and general. We need enough time to engage in critical discussions with one another.

Each week of threads is worth 15 pts

### 2. Chapter Questions

At the end of each week you will need to submit by Friday midnight your chapter questions. These are due the Friday before we begin the next chapter. Therefore if next Monday we are starting Chapter 3, you need to submit Chapter 3 Chapter Questions by previous Friday. Please see the course outline for a detailed outline of when Chapter Questions are due. The reason why they are due the Friday before we start, is that it will prepare us all for much more thought provoking discussions the following week. You would have had to read the chapter before Monday's discussion thread questions are posted and therefore your discussion thread answers as well posts to other students will be much more in depth. Your chapter questions should be multiple choice questions that you put together. You should submit 10 multiple choice questions with 4 answer options (a,b,c,d). You need to submit these via email through Canvas.

Each Chapter Questions is worth 10 points.

### 3. Research Articles

I will post 4 research articles throughout the course. Please see course calendar for a detailed description of when they will be due. You should read and answer the questions associated with the articles. Due dates are listed under course outline.

Each Research Articles is worth 20 points.

### 4. Quizzes

All quizzes will be online via Camvas. You will have one hour to complete the quizzes from the time you open the quiz online. Please use both the book and any other supplemental material (my lecture notes, your own notes) that will help in answering the questions. You will have one day to take the quiz and one hour to complete. The dates are listed below. Please contact me asap if you have any questions regarding this.
